THIRD WITNESS FOR THE DEFENCE

- No.L.102649 Tpr WELLS, B, 11 Repat Depot, sworn, states:-
- Q. How long have you known the accused?
A. About a year and a half.
- Q. Does he drink heavily?
A. Yes sir.
- Q. Where did you meet him on the night of 2 Oct 45?
A. In the Windsor Dive sir.
- Q. Was he under the influence of liquor?
A. Yes sir.
- Q. Will you tell us what happened that evening up to the point you left?
A. I met him about 2100 hrs in the Dive and we had beer there until we ran out and we went from there to another pub a short way from the Dive, when they closed we went up to Picadilly to the Marlborough Hotel. We had several pale ales and double rums. Aussant was getting sick and nearly passed out so we left there and helped him down to the tube and I lost them there in the crowd.
- Q. In what condition would you say Reid was when you left?
A. Pretty drunk, sir.
