

- A I think five acres would be sufficient.
- Q And you recommend five acres there?
- A Yes.
- Q Now Application No. 9, for a fishing station - did you visit that point?
- A Yes.
- Q What did you find there?
- A I found one shack, with evidence to show that it had been occupied - they fish there every year for sockeye, humpback, coho and dog-salmon.
- Q And it is a rather important fishing point for them?
- A Yes, and they also hunt beaver, otter and mink there.
- Q How many acres do you recommend there?
- A I recommend five acres as being reasonably necessary for them.
- Q (Examining tabulation) Application No. 10 - did you visit that point?
- A Yes.
- Q Do you consider land there necessary for the Indians?
- A Yes, it is a fishing station and a hunting station.
- Q (Examining blueprint) That is covered by a pulp lease - do you know that?
- A (Examining blueprint) Yes, according to the map it is - it is Lot 62.
- Q Did you find any evidence of actual Indian occupation and use at that point?
- A Yes, there is a house there that showed signs of occupation - of course when I say a house I mean a shack.
- Q What was that shack used for?
- A It is a base for fishing operations.
- Q It is close to the beach?
- A Yes, it is just above high water mark.
- Q Do you consider that it is important that the Indians should retain the point where this shack is, and a landing-place, which I presume is close to the shack?
- A Yes.
- Q And do you think it would be a hardship if the Indians were deprived of that?
