

PUTNAMVILLE,

A village on Reynold's Creek, in the Township of Dorchester, County of Middlesex, five miles from Ingersoll and 16 from London, on the Ingersoll and London Gravel Road. Mails daily. Population 250. Robert Craig, postmaster.

Reynold's Creek furnishes excellent hydraulic power, which is taken advantage of by Nelson Wait in his flour and saw-mills. They were built in 1853 of frame, and are of the following dimensions:—grist-mill 40 × 50, 2 storys, with two run of stone. The saw-mill measures 40 × 60 feet. Six hands are employed in the two mills, and custom work in general done at the grist-mill. Mr. Wait cuts half a million feet of lumber annually in his saw-mill.
