THE CANADIAN NORTH-WEST HOMESTEAD

REGULATIONS.

Any even numbered section of Dominton Lands in Manitoka or the Northick Territories, excepting 8 and 25, which has no been homestended, or reserved to provide wood lots for settlers, or for other purposes, may be solved to a settlers, or for other purposes, may be also been do for family, or any mais over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter sec-tion of 108 cares, more or less.

HOMESTRAD DUTIES

A settler who has been granted an entry fer a homestead is required by the provisions of the Dominion Lands Act and the amendments theretô to perform the conditions connected herewith, under one of the following plans:

(2) If the father (or mother, if the father is deceased) or any person who is eligible to make a homestead in a homestead in the state of the Act, resides upon a farm in the vicinity of this land entered for by such person as a homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence prior to obtaining patent may be astisfied by such person residing with the father or mother.

(3) If a settler has obtained a patent for his homestead, or a certificate for the issue of such patent countersigned in themanner prescribed by this Act, and has obtained entry for a second homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the first homestead, if the second homestead is in the vicinity of the Sast homestead.

(4) If the settler has his permanent residence upon farming land owned by him in the vicinity of his household, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the said land.

A settler who avails himself of the provisions of Clauses (2)(3) or (4) must cultivate 30 acres of his homestead, or substitute 30 head of stock, with buildings for their accommodation, and have besides 30 acres substantially fenced.

Every homesteader who fails to comply with the requirements of the homesteader law is liable to have his entry cancelled, and the land may be again thrown open for entry.

APPLICATION FOR PATENT

Should be made at the end of the three years before the Local Agent, Sub-Agent or the Homesteed Inspector. Before making applica-tion for patent the settler must give six months notice in writing to the Commissioner of Dominion Lands at Ottawa of his intention to do so.
