

WEST LAND REGULATIO The sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, who was at the commencement of the present war, and has since continued to be a British subject or a subject of an allied or neutral country, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion Land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at Dominion Lands agency or Sub-Agency for District. Eatry by proxy may be made on certain conditions. In certain districts a homesteader may secure an adjoining quarter-section as pre-emption. Price \$3.00 per acre.
