Emphasizing the splendid manner in which the women of the Old Land have been doing the man's work in the front in all callings, she expressed the opinion that the women workers would be the mainstay of the country in the industrial influence. With the war on their time taken up in war work and the lack of domestic help, she stated that the women of the Old Land were serving of hot meals by some central system, and also community relief from their domestic duties. "You can't have it both ways," she said. "The average British house wife does not begin to possess the many labor-saving devices that are available in the States of Canada. Coal grates in the separate rooms, with coal having to be carried up stairs, is simply an illustration

Asked she had any special message for Canadian women, Mrs. Pankhurst said: "What more can I say than to express the belief that they will be able to do more than men, if they have already so nobly done. It has been a perfect marvel to me to witness the splendid manner in which Canadian women kept their homes during the war, and to see them so active in patriotic effort."

In closing, she remarked that women were usually classed as conservative, but she believed that the future would show that they were in addition most progressive. They welcomed the widening inclusion of their sex in the privileges of the franchise, but would know no party in the ballot box, seeking only to advance the cause for equal and humanitarian measures.
