MATSON AND DOYLE Certain Alterations Which Are of Importance to Relocators.

In the gold commissioner's office there was posted today the two following notices, which are given in full for the reason that they may be of importance to the people who are watching the opening of these claims for a chance to stake.

In the matter of the list of claims situated within the limits of the Doyle concession which will be open for placer mining location at noon on the 25th of February, 1903, which notice was posted in this office on the 10th instant, the following alterations are hereby made, namely:

"Regarding creek placer mining claims Nos. 9, 10 and 11 on Boulder

creek, the right limit of Nos. 9 and 10, and the lower 100 feet on the right limit of No. 11 will not be open for location.

Regarding the lower and upper halves of the left limit of No. 2 above discovery, Fox gulch, the same is covered by the lease and consequently will not be open for location.

In the matter of the list of claims situated within the limits of the Matson concession, which will be open for placer mining location at noon on the 25th of February, 1903, the following alterations are made, namely:

Regarding the right limit of creek placer mining claims lower and upper halves No. 3 above discovery on Fox gulch, the same is covered by the lease, and therefore will not be open for location on the 25th of February, 1903.

Regarding 4A, 7A and 10A on Adams gulch, such parts of same which are within the limits of the Matson concession will not be open for location on the 25th instant, but all of the great powers, finally Kamehameha became so importunate that he wanted Dr. Judd to charter a vessel and go to Panama, thus across to Washington as soon as possible to commence bargaining the islands.

MARKET REPORTS

Situation Quiet During the Past Week

Little Change in Quotations - Fresh Stock Has Begun Arriving Over the Ice.

There has been practically no change in the market situation since last week either as to visible quantities on hand or prices. Trade has been quiet, though several rather large outfits have been put up for the Tanana.

Monday evening a trader arrived with a quantity of butter and twenty four cases of choice bacon which is finding a ready sale.

Certain lines of milk are running quite low. Jersey has been practically out for some time and there is but little more Reinder in sight. The meat situation remains unchanged and is likely to continue so the remainder of the season.

Corned beef has jumped from \$2.50 to \$4 a case and retailers are now giving but two tins for a dollar. Potatoes, onions and ham are among the commodities which can be depended upon holding their own for the remainder of the winter.
