



Premier Norris Declares There Must be a Recognition of Diverse Interests

AGREE ON LOW TARIFF

Farmers Cannot Buy Machinery at Present Prices When Wheat Price Goes Down

Co-operation and compromise were he key notes struck at the joint meetngs of the Manitoba Livestock men and the Grain Growers' on Wedneslay evening. Co-operation by the armers with the returned soldiers to e settled on the land was the plea ntered by W. J. Black, Chairman of ominion Soldiers' Land Settlement Board. Sympathetic help was necesary for the success of the plans for ocating the men and to enable them o make a success of farming after eing located. Premier Norris was he exponent of compromise. While tating he was not offering any advice e declared that the divergent intersts of Eastern, Western and Middle 'anada could only be served by ompromise and he urged the farmers ot to be extremists, Canada must ave revenue to meet the large inebtedness of the country and his uggestion was that the farmers agree o a low tariff, suggesting about welve and a half per cent, as a asis. This low tariff he declared ould vield more returns than the resent high imposts and it would end to lower costs of farm machinery articularly stimulating agriculture, ur basic and great wealth producing dustry. Costs must be lowered beause the price of wheat is certain to ag and while it is possible to pay resent prices for implements while vheat is worth more than two dollars bushel, it will not be possible to do o when wheat is one dollar or seveny-five cents. 
