FATHER AND SON DROWNED.
Were Fishing in Black River, Near Picton.

Picton, May 5.—By the capsizing of a punt while three men were fishing last night at Black River bridge, two men, William Mack and his fourteen-year-old son, were drowned. The bodies were found this morning by Captain Jarvis, of Milford, and a party of searchers. It seems that the three men—Wm. Mack, Fred Peeling and the former's son—were out in the creek spearing pike. They were meanwhile attending to a hoop net, and it was while pulling out the stake, which suddenly gave way, that the boat capsized. The two men, who were upright in the punt, were thrown overboard, and the young boy went under with the overturning of the craft. Peeling swam ashore, but the other two sank, and in the darkness of midnight attempt at rescue was utterly impossible.

The elder Mack was a well known former fisherman of the Black River district. He was aged about fifty years, and leaves a wife and several children.

ELECTIONS IN QUEBEC.
Cabinet Has Chosen June 8th as the Date.

Quebec, May 5.—At a meeting of the Quebec Provincial Cabinet, held this forenoon, and presided over by Premier Gouin, it was decided to dissolve the House of Assembly on June 8. Instead of doing that for which they borrowed money in 1905 they appear to have been pouring it into Canada to buy timber lands and control all the lumber companies there.

ECONOMY CARRIED TOO FAR.
Sandwich Council Cuts Out Payment for Police Protection.

Sandwich, May 5.—As a result of the Council's failure to appoint a police constable for the town, several property owners are thinking seriously of applying to Attorney-General Foy to take some action. At the February meeting of the Town Council it was decided by a majority of one that the salary of \$150 a year, attached to the job of chief of police was too much, and it was cut off. Chief Master, who resigned, had held the position for thirty years, and there has been no official police protection in the town since.

DON'T PICK BUTTERCUPS.
They Cause Fever, Says a Philadelphia Doctor.

Philadelphia, May 5.—That the picking of buttercups is injurious to the health of children is the theory of Dr. W. W. Chalfonte, of 1,435 North Sixth street. He declared to-day at a meeting of physicians that some cases of "buttercup fever" are not measles at all, but are the effects of gathering buttercups and inhaling their perfume. "Buttercup fever" is the term Dr. Chalfonte gives the disease. "In Germany and Holland there are laws forbidding the growing and picking of buttercups," said the physician. "Land-owners are cautioned and dairy inspectors are assigned to see the pastures are free of the flowers. In these countries epidemics of 'buttercup fever' came regularly, and in some cases the disease proved fatal."

KILLED BY A TRAIN.
Old Mohawk, Indian Met Death Near Belleville.

Belleville, May 5.—Seth Maracle, one of the highly respected Indians of the Mohawk reserve, residing two miles west of the village of Marysville, was instantly killed by being struck by a Grand Trunk freight yesterday afternoon. The man was returning from the village with a quantity of groceries and was walking on the track. When the engineer blew the whistle Maracle turned around and in his excitement stepped on the wrong track. His head was terribly crushed and death was instantaneous. Coroner Yeomans, after an investigation, decided that an inquest was unnecessary. Maracle was 62 years old, and leaves a widow and a large grown-up family.

Exporters—Export steers, of which there were few on sale, sold from \$2.50 to \$2.80; \$1 to \$2 per cwt. Butchers—Picked butchers' sold at \$5.75 to \$6; loads of good to choice butchers' \$5.50 to \$5.75; medium, \$5 to \$5.25; common, \$4.75 to \$4.90; cows, \$4.50 to \$4.75 for good, and common to medium cows, \$3.50 to \$4.25; canners \$2 to \$3 per cwt.
