LEGISLATURE

The Legislature opened on the 7th instant. The Speech from the Throne congratulated the province on the success of the Prohibition Act; and contained notice of legislation to make more certain the securing of redress for wrongs which have been committed against the province in connection with the St. John Valley Ry; legislation based on Mr. John Hall's Public Health Report; measures to secure for this province a reasonable proportion of the shipbuilding contracts to be given by the federal government; a bill based upon the conclusions of the Workmen's Compensation Commission; a Highway bill, a Forest bill, and game and mining amendments; also, certain measures to supplement the revenues of the province.

"The Fighting Trail" Most Unique Film

Scenes Taken in Wildest Recesses of Sierras—Picture 8 Months in Making

"The Fighting Trail," the Greater Vitagraph serial which will begin its run at the Happy Hour on Friday, Saturday March 29th and 30th and Monday April 1st is said to be the most remarkable thing of the kind ever produced. It is a story of mystery, intrigue, love and adventure—with accent on the latter—set in the vast reaches of the American mountains. Of the 32,000 feet of film which make up the fifteen episodes of the play, only a few feet, it is declared, show interiors. All the rest of it is outdoor photography and for this reason it has been labelled "the first all outdoor serial ever made"

Most of the scenes were taken in the Yosemite Valley and other sections of the Sierra Nevada and the picture is said to contain some of the finest mountain photography ever registered by the camera. William Duncan, directed the picture and played the leading role. The heroine is Carol Holloway. Others in the cast are George Holt, Joe Ryan, one of the greatest riders in the world, and Walter Rodgers.

An unique feature of the big serial is that Miss Holloway is the only woman character in the pictures, and with the exception of a few crowd scenes, the only one who appears in it.

The picture was eight months in the making and more than 1,000 persons were used in one scene—the burning of a town. For this a modern town with more than 200 buildings was built just to have the torch applied to it.

THE PROGRESS OF AGRICULTURAL INSTRUCTION

In 1913 the Agricultural Instruction Act was placed upon the Canadian Statute book. The object was to promote the further development of Agriculture, and thereby offset in some measure the attractions and inducements offered by life in urban centres. The originators of the policy reached the conclusion, that, among the weaknesses of the rural social system, two were especially noteworthy. It was apparent, in the first place that the knowledge available in respect to agriculture was not being spread and made use of as rapidly and widely as a general improvement in conditions necessitated. The second evident weakness was that the school instruction given to country boys and girls, instead of inclining them towards farm life, was influencing them towards urban occupations. The Act contemplated a remedy for these defects. An annual grant of Federal money was allotted to each of the Provinces for a period of ten years so that all might have ample means to extend agricultural teaching, both in the schools and out of them. Co-operation between the Dominion Department of Agriculture, and the provincial departments of agriculture and education was contemplated. In this way the Dominion, in allotting money to be expended by the provinces, might exercise a guiding and controlling influence without unduly restricting the field of activities in which the provinces might conclude to operate. To indicate the nature and extent of the efforts made by the provinces to "abandonish the objects in view," pamph-
