By a legislative enactment of th United States Senate passed July 1st it has become necessary for toreign suudents in United States schools and hospitals to obtain so-called immigration visa. This visa states each applicant must appear in person at an U.S. consular office. Photographs, birth a letter of identification must be at hand. The immigration visa fee is \$10 in American gold or paper and \$10.40 in Canadian currency. The applicant must state to what school or training hospital he or she intends to go. The Senate, by the same act passed a list of ap proved schools and training hospi tals for foreign students. In this 1.st ar some 160 training hospitals and schools: a foreign student can not obtain his immigration visa unless his school is on this list of approved schools or is placed school without this visa is liable to

LIBERALS RETAIN **BOTH SEATS IN QUEBEC PROVINCE**

Two Liberal candidates were turned in the Federal by-elections held Tuesday in the Quebec province constituencies of Rimouski and the St. Antoine division of Montreal. In the former Major General Sir Eugene Fiset, late Deputy Minister of Defence was elected over his Conservative opponent Elzear Sasseville, advocate; of Rimouski, by a majority which late returns placed around 1900.

In the latter Alderman W.J Hus hion was returned by a majority of approximately 1000 over the Con servative standard bearer, W.M. Birks of Montreal.

Major General Fiset thus occup ies the parliamentary seat tha was held by his father, J.B.K Fiset from 1872 to 1878 and again in 1887 and 1896. The seat is tradit ionally Liberal although it was re presented by a Conservative. H Boulay from 1911 to 1917.

The vacancy which has just been filled by the election of Gen. Fiset was caused by the resignation of the late member, L. D'Anjou who was appointed registrar for the

The contest was hard fought and not infrequently national issues purely local and personal. General Fiset in the course of his camseven year old controversy, regard ing war time conscription and disclaimed any responsibility for either the act or the administration of it His opponents assailed him for preview of the fact that at the age of 49 he had retired from public service on a pension of \$6000 year and that he was now offering himself for further service. The broader national issues were presented by many of the government issues, notably by Hon. E. Lapointe who fought hard for the candidate.

In the Metropolitan division, the campaign was conducted with considerable vigor on both sides and both the Prime Minister and the header of the opposition were heard in support of their candidates

St. Antoine was traditionally Con servative but in the general election of 1921 the constituency went Liberal, returning Hon. W. G.

Mr. Mitchell resigned his seat du ing the last session of parliament against the fiscal policy of the government. The contest thus necessitated was held by both parties to be an even test of the popularity of that - policy and was accepted as a "referendum" vote by Liberals and Conservatives.

A schism was created in the Con servatives ranks by the appearance of two candidates in the field, Les lie G. Bell and Wm. M. Birks The breach was healed however by the withdrawal of Mr. Bell and a straight fight ensued with Mr Hishion who had represented the St. Anne's district in the,local legislature and who was also an Alderman of the city representing the Liberal party .
