CONGESTION OF SEA TRAFFIC. LONDON, To-day.

Advices have been received by the Government to the effect that British and Canadian shipping interests have made representations to British authorities for the release of a number of captured German ships. This action results from the taking over of so many ships of British register by the Admiralty, and the consequent congestion of traffic. Shipping interests deem it perfectly proper to release some of the German ships and man them by Britishers, and let them ungage in commerce. Over four hundred ships have been seized and a few of them sold by auction, but the latter course may not be folllowed generally. The Admiralty has the matter under advisement. LONDON, To-day.

Advance Guard Drill.


