The Reid Newfoundland Company eceived a message from Capt. Tavernor of the S.S. Sagona stating that his ship had grounded on a mud bank in Menador Passage near Louisburg at ten o'clock yesterday morning. Owing to the thick fog and heavy ice the ship was forced out of the regular course, but fortunately was steaming slowly at the time of striking. The S.S. Kyle was despatched to the assistance of the Sagona, but her services were not required, as by seven o'clock she had worked her way clear. A later message received from Capt. Tavernor reported his ship uninjured and that he was proceeding to Louisburg to load freight. The loss of such a valuable boat at this period of the year would be a great set back to the general trade of the country, and her escape was a fortunate one.
