EARLY ME

BRITISH SUB. SUNK. LONDON, Feb. 4. The Admiralty announcement tonight confirms the claim in the Turkish official statement that the submarine E-14, which was sent into the Mediterranean on the night of Jan. 27th, under orders to complete the destruction of the former German cruiser Zechow, was sunk off Kum Kale, Seven miles west of Mardin. The claim was based on the report that the E-22 also was sunk, declaring she returned to her base.

ENOUGH TRANSPORTS AVAILABLE. WASHINGTON, Feb. 4. Secretary Daniels today authorized a statement that the Navy is assured of enough transport facilities to make sure that there will be 500,000 American troops in France early this year as was stated by Secretary Baker recently before the Senate Military Committee.

ITALIAN CITIES DAMAGED. ROME, Feb. 4. Venice and a number of towns on the Venetian plain have been bombed by enemy airmen, according to the Italian official issued to-night. While no damage and no casualties resulted from the attack on Venice, considerable destruction was brought about in the towns of Padua, Trvin, and Mestre, where also a number of civilians were killed and wounded.

THE U. S. FIRST DRAFT. WASHINGTON, Feb. 4. Provost Marshal Gen. Crowder today announced that the movement of the last increments of men selected in the first draft will begin on Feb. 23rd and continue for a period of five days. This will complete the operation of the first draft, as all the States will have furnished their full quota. The movement will bring the strength of the National Army up to 685,000 men contemplated in the first draft.

TAKES ISSUE WITH WAR SECRETARY. WASHINGTON, Feb. 4. Secretary of War Baker's recent statement to the Senate Military Committee that the United States would have half a million soldiers in France early this year and that prospects were not unpromising for ships to carry a million more who were ready during the year, were characterized by Senator Hitchcock, Democrat from Nebraska, in an address to-day as absolutely preposterous and so exaggerated as to convey an entirely false impression as to what we can do and what we are doing. Supporting the committee's bill for a War Cabinet and Munitions Director, Senator Hitchcock declared Secretary Baker was no doubt sincere but was misled by lack of information regarding the scarcity of ships, into making sanguine statements. He said President Wilson himself does not know the real situation, and cited this statement as an illustration of absence of Government co-ordination. Administration leaders prepared a reply to Senator Hitchcock whose speech launched the debate which has been impending since Secretary Baker made his statement and the President made known his opposition to the Military Committee's plans for reorganizing the Government's war machinery.

BRITISH CASUALTIES. LONDON, Feb. 4. British casualties reported during the week ending to-day, totalled 6,384, divided as follows: Died of wounds, officers 51, men 1,623; wounded or missing, officers 173, men 4,808. The lowest mark for many Suprem
