LONDON, Oct. 9.

King George was waited on by Premier MacDonald this morning, following the Government's defeat in the House of Commons last night and agreed to a dissolution of Parliament. Mr. MacDonald left Buckingham Palace after an audience which began at 10 oclock and lasted an hour. It was officially announced that he had asked the King for a dissolution of Parliament, in line with his previously amnounced policy of appealing to the country through a general election, to approve of the course pursued by his Government.


