THE EXHIBITION.

Unparalleled Success!

AN IMMENSE CROWD.

SECOND DAY.

Wednesday, Sept. 17.

The general public are crowding to the show in good earnest to-day.

Over half a dozen persons were unceasingly engaged during the morning in selling entrance tickets, and the pile of "quarters" so rapidly accumulating must be a big one.

The streets leading to the grounds were thronged with well-dressed pedestrians, their faces turned southward; and on the arrival of the various trams the throng now and again increased to a dense crowd, which filled the sidewalks and overflowed far into the roadway.

Long lines of baggage and waggons, standing in rank upon rack before every hotel in town, attest the number of country visitors.

Carpenters are still busily at work on the extra accommodation for live stock, and additional rooms in this department are being rapidly added.

Impressions have arrived since yesterday morning, and the show in this department is a most varied one.

The interior of the main building is now all in place, and the building is filled with an ever-increasing number of exhibitors.

The judges have been heard at work since yesterday morning, and the Secretary's books are rapidly filling up with the names of the prize-takers.

Shortly before noon the horses were brought out into the enclosure, and the judging of them commenced.

Many enthusiastic lovers of horse flesh surrounded the ring, admiring the noble proportions and graceful action of magnificent animals as they were led round by their grooms or owners.

The unexampled character of the show of live stock is remarked on every hand.

Men who able to speak with authority on the subject say that such a numerous and excellent collection of cattle and horses was never before brought together in one show in Canada.

No Provincial fair has ever equalled the display at Guelph on this occasion.

The Directors may well feel proud of so gratifying a result.

The "side shows"—Punch and Judy—the usual quack medicine vendors and retailers of heavy drams of horsey which are held forth to knots of credulous listeners. Ample provision is made for sustaining hungry man by the numerous refreshment sheds and stalls.

Many of the latter have piles of fine peaches, grapes, melons, &c.; whilst the more substantial accompaniments of cakes and cheese are not wanting.

The Brampton Brass Band were on the stand shortly before noon, and added to the gaiety of the surroundings by their excellent playing.

The weather was fine, but became cloudy towards noon.

We continue our description of the exhibits.—HORSES.

W. B. Telfer, Pilkington, has on exhibition a splendid span of matched carriage horses; they are dark bay and show off to good advantage.

J. W. Watt, Nichol, a span of heavy draughts of cokes and cheers are very superior.

Isaac Musselman, Woolwich, and agricultural stallion—Woolwich Champion." Jacob Christian, Woolwich, shows 'England's Glory,' an imported stallion possessing some very good points; it was imported in 1872; also thorough-bred blood stallions, 2 year old. John Jackson, a 2 year old black stallion, imported in 1872. John Hewer, Guelph, shows a fine bright bay stallion, the "Ontario Chief," 3 years old; also Guelph Champion, an agricultural horse—both fine animals.

Robert Guthrie, Owen Sound, a gray stallion, prior thorough-bred chestnut colt, one year old. John Gordon, Puslinch, a 3 year old filly, brood mare and filly. Alex McCosachie, Nichol, a dark chestnut stallion, 2 year old. Jas Stone, Guelph, Defiance Morgan, 3 years old. Billy Guthrie, Owen Sound, a gray stallion, French Lion, and John Long, a 2 year old stallion. W. Fawcett, Ephraim, shows Sir William Wallace a very fine stallion. David Gerrard, Guelph, brood mare and foal. J. W. Stubbis, Meaford, a roaster stallion, Sir Robert Blyde, possessing some good qualities. Hugh Roberts, Pilkington, one span of fine black horses. Alex Fleming, Puslinch, yearling filly. Douglas Bros., Port Nelson, thorough-bred bay stallion, Sharp Catcher, 5 years old; black stallion, agricultural, Benforth, 5 years old. A. Blyde, roaster, 2 years old. W. Dunn, Waterloo, bay filly, 3 year old, roaster. W. Gerrie, Ancester, bay filly, heavy draught, 3 years old; also bay filly, heavy draught, 1 year old. J. E. Boyd, Wellesley, bay stallion, roaster, Billy Brown, J. & G. Keith, Nichol, bay filly, 2 years old, roaster, which took the first prize last year; also brood mare, roaster. G. G. Nichol, Beverley, exhibits bright bay stallion, roaster, four years old. Thomas Nichol, Blenheim, grey stallion, general purpose, two years old, a fine horse; also a span of draught mares, four and five years old, both splendid animals.

SHEEP. Mr. Whitlaw, Guelph, has three pens of very fine Leicester sheep, consisting of one imported ram, one pair imported aged ewes, two pair shearing ewes, two pair shearing ewes, and two pair ewe lambs, six ram lambs, and five ewe lambs, all of the best quality.

Joseph Parkinson, Eramosa, has three pens of Leicesters, consisting of an aged ram, 4 ewes, 8 ram lambs and 6 ewe lambs, all of the very superior quality.

Adam Oliver, Downie, shows four pens of Leicesters, comprising 2 aged rams (one imported), 12 ram lambs, 4 aged ewes (one imported), four shearing ewes and 8 ewe lambs.

James Laidlaw, Guelph, has a pen of Leicesters—6 ram lambs—all first class animals.

James Russell, Markham, exhibits six pens of very fine Leicesters, several of them being first prize animals; they consist of four shearing rams, 4 shearing ewes, 4 aged ewes, pair ewe lambs, and 2 ram lambs; also four pens of Cotswolds—2 pair of shearing ewes and 4 shearing rams.

Sidney Smith, Requeing, shows two pens of Leicesters, consisting of 1 shearing ram, 3 ram lambs, pair ewe lambs, pair shearing ewes, and 2 pair ewe lambs.

Thos. & W. Walde, Requeing, have three pens of fine Leicesters and Lincolns, comprising 1 aged ram, 7 ram lambs, 1 pair aged ewes, and 2 pair shearing ewes.

W. F. Evans, Puslinch, shows one pen of very fine ram lambs, long wool. Philip Brooks, Biddulph, shows three pens of very good ewes, consisting of 2 shearing ewes, 2 aged ewes,
