Conneaut, Ohio, Dec. 10.—The car ferry Conneaut, carrying a large crew and possibly a few passengers, is two days overdue. It is believed the ferry has been lost.

The car ferry ran between here and Port Stanley, Ont. She carried a crew of twenty-five men. Her course is near Long Point, where wreckage was reported by the steamer W. B. Davock, by wireless today.


