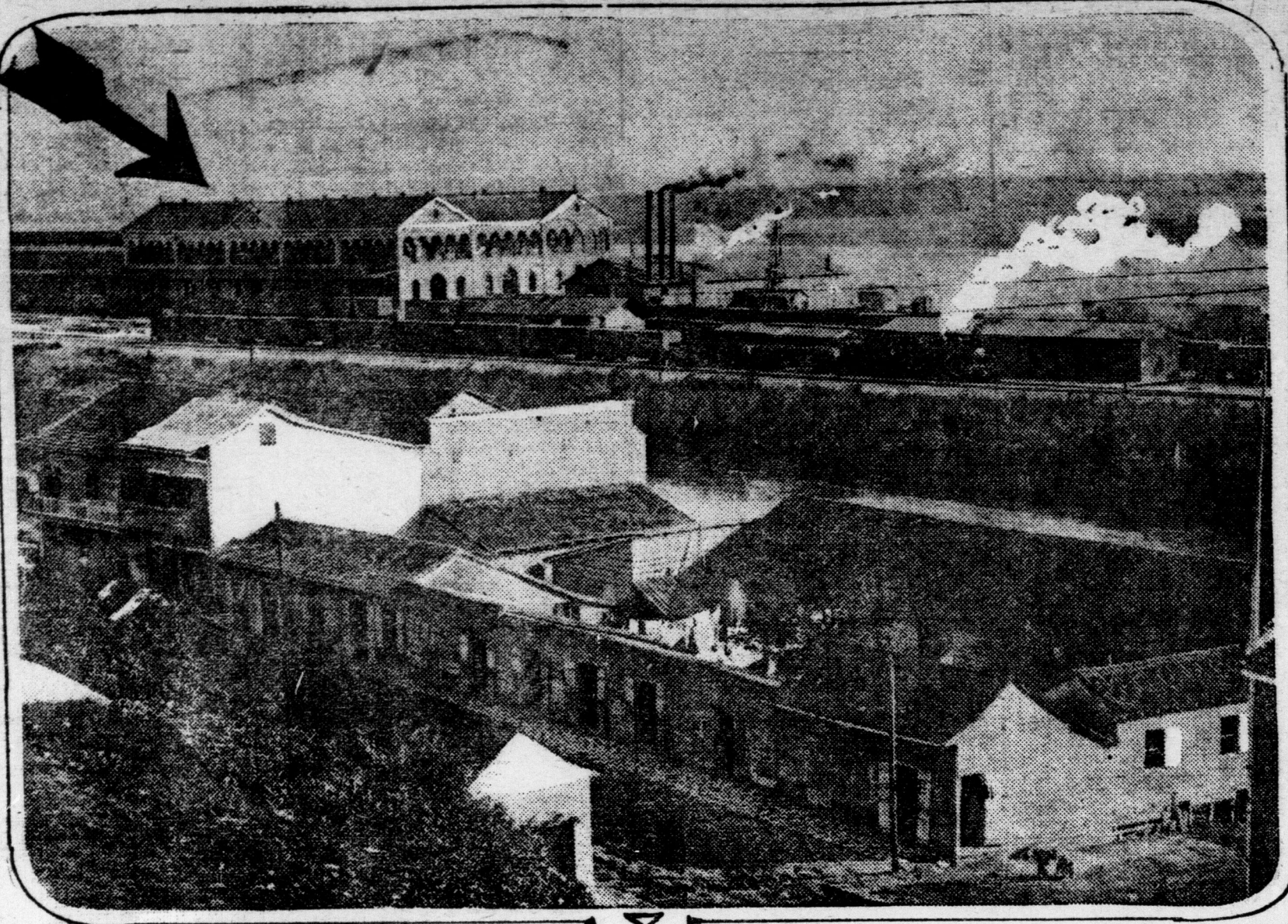


TAMPICO—MEXICAN CITY WHICH MAY BE BOMBARDED CHILDREN'S SCALP SORES ARE HEALED BY ZAM-BUK

Tampico, the storm centre of Mexico, in the event of war with the United States, is a most unhealthy, heated atmosphere in the southeastern corner of the state of Tamaulipas, at the mouth of the Panuco River. It was an Aztec city. In 1683 it was destroyed by the pirate Lorencilla and was not rebuilt until 1823. It received the name Santa Ana de Tamaulipas in 1824, and was the scene of a Mexican victory over the Spanish in 1827.

It is a city of some commercial importance and high death rate. Lagoons and rushes, rising out of the blue slime, surround it and invade it when the health authorities sleep.

The population hovers around 18,000, sliding back 500 or 300 at intervals as the inhabitants shrivel before an epidemic of yellow fever.

The eastern and poorer section of the town is built on low ground three feet above the river, subject to inundation. The western section is built on high

Ground 150 feet above sea level, and holds private residences, good water and drainage. The business section is well built, with wide streets, market places and gas and electric lights.

It is the junction of two railroads, the Monterey and Gulf line, running north, northwest to Ciudad Victoria and Monterey, and a branch of the Mexican Central running west to San Luis Potosi. Then there are river boats on the Panuco, plying to the mouth of the Tamazunchale, 135 miles away. Another boat line runs to Tamaulipas, on the Texpan Canal, a distance of 77 miles. The industries are oil refineries, ice factories, canneries and clothing factories, and a small ship yard. The exports are oil, mining and grading products, wool, honey, wool, hemp and silver bullion from San Luis Potosi, Aguascalientes, Toluca and Monterey. It is the east heart of northeastern Mexico and rivals Vera Cruz as a commercial port.

REUNION ASSOCIATION IS FORMALLY REORGANIZED

London Firms and Businessmen Unite to Bring Out Families of Deserving Immigrants—Eighteen Applications on Hand.

The organization meeting of the Imperial Home Reunion Association was held in the board of trade rooms yesterday afternoon.

The object of the association, which was formed under the auspices of the London Industrial Bureau, is to assist deserving British working people in permanent employment here in bringing their families from the British Isles to join them in London.

The association was formed under rules similar to those governing the other branches of the association.

There are branches in 28 cities in the Dominion, including Montreal, Toronto and Winnipeg. Eighteen Applications Already. "There are eighteen applications in already," stated Gordon Philip, "which, if granted, would bring 75 people to London. A man pays 20 per cent down and the rest in small monthly payments."

Ex-Ald. Wm. H. Spittal, the father of the movement in London, spoke briefly.

"We had no difficulty whatever in getting the subscriptions to the \$10,000 guarantee fund, which was necessary," he said. "It will prove an excellent thing for London, and I wish to thank the gentlemen who have aided us with subscriptions."
