
# TAMPICO-MEXICAN CITY WHICH MAY BE BOMBARDED CHILD

The exports are oil, mining and grazing products, wood, honey, wool, hemp and silver bullion from San Luis Potosi, Aguascalientes, Torreon and Monterey. It is the coast heart of northeastern Mexico and rivals Vera Cruz as a com-
