

BY-LAW EASILY CARRIED BY THE RATEPAYERS

LIGHT VOTE ON DOERING TRUNK COMPANY BY-LAW Polled.

Majority above required Two-Thirds is Thirty-Nine, while four hundred and ninety-five votes are polled.

The Doering Trunk Company Industrial By-Law was easily carried by the ratepayers yesterday. The vote was 369 for and 126 against, a majority of 243 above the required two-thirds. Every polling division gave a substantial majority in favor of the by-law. Only a bare half of the vote was polled. The vote was as follows:
