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PUSHING WESTWARD.

A Great Work Being Accomplished on the New Railway.

Work on the western extension of the Ontario & Pacific Railway continues to be pushed forward with a vigor that has ever characterized that company in all its undertakings.

The bridge has been laid through the Chapter House grounds up to Richmond street, and the work of grading west of that point has been nearly completed.

Between George and Talbot streets there is quite a cut, and the earth taken from there is being used to fill in at low-lying points adjacent.

Overhead bridge has been erected across a lane leading from Oxford street to Carling's Brewery, and everything is being got in readiness for the rails.

It is expected to be completed in four or five days, and then the creation of the bridge will be begun with all delay.

Large quantities of rails, timbers, iron pipes for culverts and other material are constantly arriving, and every thing indicates a speedy completion of the work.

Meanwhile quite a transformation is being wrought on the other side of the river, the route being almost in shape for track laying from London West to over beyond Hyde Park.
