Manchester, Eng., June 18 .- The Guardian is informed that the Government of Russia is about to give instructions to its agent in Paris to purchase all of the its agent in Paris to purchase and of the shares of the Suzz Canal it is possible to obtain in the market. The Imperial Treasury at St. Petersburg, according to this statement, has allotted \$20,000,000 with which to acquire the desired share within the next three years.


