Association Lambton County Corn Growers Associ-ation will hold a corn show in Petrolia ation will hold a corn show in Petrolia during the coming winter. This was decided at a meeting of the directors held in the Agricultural office, Petrolia, last Saturday. Those present were unanim-ously agreed that the County of Lambton is admirably suited to the production of seed corn and that a corn show would be the best means of bringing the growers together and showing them what could be accomplished along these lines. An extensive and attractive prize list was drawn up, which pratty well covers all the varieties of corn suitable for the County of Lambton. Special prizes have been donated by several individuals and firms and a grand sweepstakes silver cup is being offered for the best ten ears of corn exhibited at the show.
