The Digby Pier.

The rebuilding of the steamboat pier at Digby is rapidly being pushed forward under the supervision of Mr. L. Oliver.

No pains are being spared to make it to the full extent of the pier. The north side is double constructed to allow the trains to get alongside of the steamers.

The pier is 14 feet in breadth to be erected in a few days. Besides the warehouse there will be a covered stage for hackmen and truckmen.

The building erected a few years ago for waiting room and offices will meet the requirements in this respect. Mr. Oliver expects to have the pier finished about Christmas, although there is a large amount of work still to be performed.

The sheathing of the north side, from the shore to the end, will make the pier an excellent breakwater against the heavy sea which is blown up by the northeast gales that prevail in the winter season and which also greatly interfere with the docking of steamers on the south side.
