There are at present twenty,—one blind, one paralyzed, one bedridden for upwards of six years, several of them very old, (one who died there during the past year was upwards of 90,) and nearly all helpless from sickness or infirmity of some kind.

The children, all deprived of one Parent, and in *most* cases, neglected or forsaken by the other.
