They are, in my opinion, one of the best varieties for all purposes of any of pure-bred fowls. Their plumage is glossy black in color, with a brilliant metallic sheen or

lustre, which will not become soiled like the light-colored bird's. They are very hardy, easily confined, splendid layers, and are highly esteemed in England as a table fowl.
