F O N E T I C S T U D I Z.

Az r̄ider in fonetics at Yuniversiti Coll̄ej, Liverpūl, Dr R. J. Lloyd, M. A., deliv̄erid his inögyural lectyur on "De Yutiliti and Interest ov Fonetic Studiz". Fonetics ment r̄iali ðe saiens ov ðe producson and natyur ov spōkn saundz, and ði art ov ðer riproducion. Fonetics had bin in ði ear for a jenerasian. Ellis and Sweet had restörd tu Chöser his orijinal melodi and givn bak tu Anglo-Sacson sumthing laik its orijinal saundz. Brugmann (pronauns, brux'man-, x gutural) and uðerz hav establisht in skeleton form ðe fonetic filiation ov ði Aryan langwejez. Ðe had dun ðis in spait ov veri backward development ov fonetic saiens itself. A satisfactori saiens ov langwej shud be abl tu ecpres ol fizical fenomena ov langwej in termz ov mater and mosion. Evri saund ov langwej öt tu b̄i ultimatl ecprest, az tu its orijin, in termz ov ðe mūvments and pozisionz ov ði organzcrieting it; and az tu its acūstic natyur, in termz ov ðe rezulting arial mūvments. Ðe thing herd, hauever, iz a subjectiv sensasion, subject tu saicic löz. Investigesion had bin bizi on ol ðiz aspects ov spōkn saundz; h̄i (ðe lectyurer) had traid tu du his shar. His thiori ov ðe producson and acūstic constitiusion ov vaelz, ov hwich a sketch woz givn tu ðe Liverpūl Litereri and Filosofic Sosaieti in 1890, woz nau waidli accepted in prinsipl, ðo h̄i had had tu corect it in sum arithmetical detalz. H̄i had begun tu autlain a similar thiori ov ðe consonants, but woz gratali hamperd for wont ov a fōnograf. Ðe mōr perfectli fonetics becam a saiens, ðe mōr acyuratli and confidentli it cud b̄i aplaid az an art. Ðis cud b̄i illustrated in referens tu eni langwej, Inglish, foren, or clasical. Az tu clasic langwejez he shōd hau ðer ansient pronunsiasion had bin recuverd bai fonetic reserch, and red pesej-ez tu sho hau ðer orijinal miūzic had bin ðerbal restörd. Ecselent results atand in modern-langwej tiching in Jermani wer diu larjli tu ticherz lerning fonetics. In ðis

tiching, a cardinal fact iz: artikyulasion ov a foren saund iz olwez mōr izili, perfectli and siurli lernd bai descripsion and pratics ov muscylar eforts involvd ðan bai a mir grōping after a saund herd. Ðe chif thing tu b̄i töt and lernd iz not ðe saund, but ðe rait and eczact wa tu prodiüs it. Az tu Inglish, its preznt tendensi iz tu diverj rapidli in pronunsiasion. Yuniti ov aur langwej iz riali in danjer. Tū yirz ago h̄i had cold atension tu ðis in ðe Westminster Reviu. [A long extract from it apird in THE HERALD, Julai, '97] Fonetianz wark tu provайд practical minz tu avert ðis thretned calamiti, a calamiti tu b̄i averted in no uðer wa. Ol shud wish success tu an efort so importnt tu ðe wurld. H̄i (Dr Loid) had traid tu du sumthing tu ðis grat end. Hiz litl buk, "Norðern Inglish," gev a saientific acaunt, and niumeros eczamplz, ov pronunsiasionz yūzd bai edyucated non-provinsial Norðern Inglishmen, az Mr Gladston, pronunsiasion in meni respects intermidiet tu pronunsiasion ov an edyucated Suðern Inglishman and historicali ðolder pronunsiasion ov a non-provinsial American or Canadian. Hwen ðe varios taips ov gud Inglish hav bin descraibd competentli, it wud b̄i taim for edyucasional öþoritiz in ðe Inglish-spiking wurld tu tak up ðe kwestion ov a comon standard.—Liverpool Mercury.

M I D L A N D I N G L I S H.

Wi think Inglish ov ðe Midland Cauntiz intermidiet tu Norðern and Suðern spich, az wel az in its jiographic pozision. Norðern Inglish, historic Ængelish, ects-tendz from ðe river Humber tu ðe Scotish Hailandz; Suðern, or Sacso-Norman Inglish, iz sauth ov ðe river Temz. Midland Inglish, got bai fiuzion, stretcht intu Ulster after confiscaion ov land foloing supression ov O'Neil'z rebellion under Elizabeth hu promöted "setlm̄ent" ðerin, a polisi continyud bai Jamz I and Crumwel. Mintaim, setlm̄ent went on in Niu Ingland from 1620, and spred west thru norðern Yunaited Stats and Canada from Atlantic tu Pacific. America iz a gret melting-pot for fiuzing dialects intu avej Midland (beter namd Fiuzion) Inglish, hūz cradl woz betwin Humber and Temz.
