Petroleum.—All unaporepriated Dominion Lands in Manitoba, the North West Territories, and within the Yukon Territory are open to prespecting for petroleum and the minister may reserve for an individual or company having machinery on the land to be prospected an area of 1920 acres for such period as he may decide, the length of which shall not exceed three times the breasth. Should be prospector find oil in paying quantities and satisfactorily establish such discovery, an area not exceeding diva ercs, including the oil well will be sold to the prospector at the rate of \$8 an acre, and the remainder of the tract reserved, anney 1,200 acres, will be sold at the rate of \$8 an acre, subject to royalty at such rate as may be specified by Order in Council.
