For ye have not received the spirit of bondage again to fear; but ye have received the Spirit of adoption, whereby we cry Abba, Father. Rom. viii. 15.

## ELECT OR ELITE.

HE church of God is composed of the elect. They are not of the world; they are elected or chosen out of the world. They may be poor as was Lazarus at the rich man's gate; as was Job

when he sat in ashes; despised as was Paul when he was counted as "the filth of the world and the offscouring of all things;" rejected as was He who bore the cross, and had not where to lay his head,-still they are chosen of the Lord, elect. But there are many in this world who

seek for fellowship, not among the elect, but among the elite. They have no objection to saints, if they are wealthy, and respectable, and witty; but the mere fact that a man is elect of God, and beloved, does not commend him to their fellowship.

There are many churches composed largely of the *elite*. Their carriages roll to the door; their costly garments sweep the aisles; their delicate hands glitter with gold and flash with gems; they have their good things in this life, -but are they "the elect of God ?"

In that day, when the highest and the brightest of earth shall perish; when the *elite* shall stand side by side with beggars, condemned and doomed; "He shall send His angels, and they shall gather His *elect* from the four winds, from one end of heaven unto the other." Their days of triumph will then begin.

Remember! as great as the difference may be, today, between the elect and the *elite*, it will be greater, far, in the great Day of God.--H. L. Hastings.
