

1.3. Linguistic Distribution

The charts below shows the distribution of all indeterminate employees and employees who have been working for terms longer than three months, according to first official language for the years 1999 and 2000. The first chart shows figures for all Departmental employees; the second is for rotational employees only. The overall representation of Francophone employees as well as the representation in most individual categories is consistent with Canadian labour market availability statistics.
