

Natural Resources—Development

The Minister of Trade and Commerce, after deriding in the house our arguments in this respect in his speech on July 9 of last year, went abroad in the fall and declared in the United States precisely the very thing that we had been arguing for here and that he himself had derided here in the Canadian House of Commons. In a speech at Chicago on October 16 he advocated that United States-controlled industry accept these suggestions:

1. Provide opportunities for Canadian participation as minority shareholders in subsidiaries.
2. Provide greater chances for advancement of Canadian technicians and executives in United States controlled companies.
3. Make public more and regular information of branch operations.
4. Let Canadian branch plants take on more export business so they will act more "like good solid Canadian enterprises".

He followed that speech on the following day with a similar speech at Milwaukee. These are the very things we advocated last year. These are the things involved in the national development policy we have put before the House of Commons. Sir, let hon. members opposite understand this very well, that if they vote against the amendment tonight they will be voting against a policy that calls for precisely the same thing that the Minister of Trade and Commerce advocated in the United States last October but denounced in the House of Commons on July 9.
