

to be any more for all his Majesty's Colonies
 as may best serve their Interests.
 4. That they will one Day make them-
 selves Masters of all the British Colonies in
 North America.
 5. That the Colonies are of great Con-
 sequence to the Trade, Wealth and Naval
 Power of Great Britain, and will in future
 Time make so much larger Additions to it,
 that without the Trade, they will be
 unable to maintain their only War in
 Europe, but her Supremacy as a Maritime
 Power. And on the other Hand should be
 made use of, and the Trade gain them,
 Great Britain's Interest must necessarily be re-
 spectfully and the Subjection to the Crown
 secure, to be nothing more than a Province
 of France.
