## CHEMULPO WINS LAST AT CONNAUGHT PARK

Love Day, Heavily Played Favorite, Outside the Money—Another Win for Zodiac.

OTTAWA, Sept. 2.—Form players got some of their own back in today's races at Connaught Park when no fewer than five favorites flashed home in front. The victory of Baron De Kalb at 15 to 1 was the chief surprise. The track was fast and another great crowd turned out under beautiful weather conditions.
