

These figures give some idea of the magnitude of the school fair movement in Ontario.

The first school fair was organized in 1909, with three schools taking part. Ten years later 357 rural school fairs were held in the province, and the pupils had 69,848 home plots and made 111,823 entries. It is estimated that about 250 people saw the first school fair in which 55 pupils took part, while last fall 92,600 children and 107,590 adults attended the school fairs in Ontario. This is truly a wonderful growth.




