## INCREASE FOR POSTMEN.

Trades Council Will Try to Hasten Action at Ottawa.

The executive of the Toronto District Trades and Labor Council last night requested the secretary to send a letter to Postmaster-General Lemieux at Ottawa asking when the government intends carrying out the agreement with the Letter Carriers' Union by which the postoffice employees were to receive an advance in wages. The letter was sent last night at the close of the regular session of the council.

Last night the following officers and committees were elected to carry on the business of the Toronto council for next year: President, John H. Kennedy; vice-president, H. R. Barton; by acclamation; trustees, William Gocking, Magnus Sinclair and J. H. Thompson; municipal committee, H. R. Barton, John Corcoran, Joseph Gibbons, William Gocking and James Simpson; educational committee, H. R. Barton, J. J. Brown, James Clennon, J. S. Robinson and James Simpson. From among thirteen contestants William Gocking, James Simpson and Magnus Sinclair were elected to attend the Dominion Trades Congress at Halifax in the fall of this year.

## ZION CONGREGATIONAL CHURCH.

The trustees of "Zion" Congregational Church on College-street decided at a meeting of the congregation on Wednesday evening to continue the services during the summer, and have the pulpit supplied till the fall by various speakers. The deacons, Messrs. Freeman, Joseph and Atwell, were appointed a committee on supply. They requested Mr. J. M. Wilkinson, editor of the "Toronto World," to take the pulpit on Wednesday next Sunday (19th), but he can only give them the morning, as he has only arranged to hold service in the evening. Mr. J. M. Wilkinson will, however, preach at night in Zion Church, and Mr. Wilkinson in the morning.
