

TRAVELERS PROTECTED Railway Commission Order Clean Cars

OTTAWA, May 10.-The board allway commissioners has issued a drastic order to the railways to observe sanitary conditions upon the cars and in their stations. As a result of the applications of the Montrea Board of Trade, every railway com pany subject to the legislative authority of the parliament of Canada is or-dered: To keep clean and well ventilated all waiting rooms, closets, and to disinfect them. Employes are to give nonthly reports on condition of such; passenger cars are to be cleaned and ventilated in the same way.

To adopt bylaws preventing spitting on cars, closets, platforms, stations, etc., except in receptacles provided. To fumigate all stations or cars where infected persons have been. To fumigate all sleeping cars at least

every 30 days.
Penalty of not more than \$50 on com pany and op negligent employe not less than \$2 or more than \$15 is fixed.
