

MUTTON AND LAMB AMONG THE LUXURIES

Reached New High Record Price at Stock Yards Yesterday. DEMAND FOR HEIFERS Robert McLachlan, Well-Known Live Stock Dealer, is Dead.

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST LAND REGULATIONS.

The sole heir of a family, or any male over eighteen years of age, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Application must appear in person before the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District, and by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency (outpost sub-agency) on certain conditions.

Under the provisions of the Act, a homesteader may live upon the land for a period of three years, at least eight acres, on certain conditions. A suitable house is required, except where residence is performed in the vicinity. In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alongside his homesteaded place, \$200 per acre.
