THE COMMITTEE PROTESTANT INDUSTRIAL SCHOOL:

Gentlemen,-Since my last Report, two years ago, the general health of the School has continued uniformly good. Comparatively few cases have required medical advice, and nearly all of these have been of such a nature that they were able to attend for relief at my surgery. During the two years two deaths have occurred in connection with the School.

The School has now for several years fortunately escaped invasion from any form of infectious disease, even measles, which was so extensively epidemic during the past year,

failed to gain an entrance.

The good health of the boys in the institution, while no doubt due largely to the healthy surroundings in which they are placed, also owes much to the watchful and almost parental care of Mr. and Mrs. Norman, who continue to manage the boys with tact and firmness, as well as kindness.
