WILL TRY TO MAKE PEACE

Col. Hanbury-Williams to Endeavor to Get C. A. A. U. and Athletic Federation Together.

(Montreal Star.)

Unity of purpose. Consider Canada only. Try private differences for the sake of the national glory. These are the sentiments that will guide Col. Hanbury-Williams in his charge of the British Olympic committee, thought he would be a fit man to look after Canada's interests.

"In the Olympic games," he said, "we should win as Canada, not as certain clubs or associations. We should be unanimous. Take football, for instance, one association will say 'No' about certain players going, and another will say 'Yes,' and between the two you will lose your best men instead of the best athletic team."

"You seem to have the right idea of the situation," it was suggested. "No," he replied, "I am only trying to learn, and it seems a most difficult proposition. But I am going to learn, and no one can hinder me. I am going to understand this situation thoroughly."

"But at present my firm idea is that I should send over the best athletic teams of individuals which Canada can produce. And unless the two divided camps can be brought together and meet on national grounds and make a national job of it, and not personal prejudice to one side, I do not see myself how we will be able to send a representative athletic delegation from Canada."

"I certainly will do my best to bring them together, Canada, not certain clubs or associations. We should be unanimous. Take football, for instance, one association will say 'No' about certain players going, and another will say 'Yes,' and between the two you will lose your best men instead of the best athletic team."

"What, for instance, would be the use of mentioning to certain men going to the Olympic games, and then having one athletic body or the other send in a batch of affidavits against him, and thus wearing our dirt linen before the whole world for the eyes of the whole world as on these Olympic games."
