## GENERAL LAWS AND REGULATIONS, HINTS, ETC.—Continued

Correspondence intended for delivery in Ingersoll should be addressed "Ingersoll" or "town," with the name of street if desired. Letters should not be addressed to residences by their fancy titles, many such being similar in name to some long established Post Office, to which they are liable to be sent in the hurry of sortation and thus cause delay and consequent annoyance. If it is particularly desired to use a residential address, it should be written on the lower left hand corner of the envelope and not incorporated with the full address.

Private individuals having inconsiderable correspondence are requested to avail themselves of free delivery by carriers instead of renting boxes at the Post Office.

Packets of deeds, insurance policies, etc., entitled to transmission at the 1c. per 2 oz. rate of postage, are subject to a higher rate if they contain in addition manuscript or other matter not entitled to the lower rate.

Newspaper and book manuscript, in order to pass at reduced rates, should be addressed direct to a publisher for printing.

Address all official letters simply to "The Postmaster."

Judicious complaints from the public, where there is substantial reason for them, are of great service in drawing attention to things that require amendment.
