RAID IN BELGIUM.

"Near Wytschaete, Belgium, we made a successful raid into German trenches. Opposite Guinchy, northern France, a similar attempt by the enemy was frustrated by our fire."

Paris, July 18.—The Germans made an attack last night of the Somme, and gained ground in the vicinity of Biaches. The office announces this.

The German attack was delivered against the French positions from Biaches to La Maisonette. Several attempts to take La Maisonette failed with heavy loss to the Germans, but groups of the attacking forces spread along the canal on the east side of the Biaches where the fighting continues.

A German raid on Hill 304, on the Verdun front west of the Meuse, was broken up by French infantry fire. East of the river there was fighting with that only hard coal should be used.
