New York, May 3.—Josephine Bruno, eight years old, was found murdered in the cellar of the tenement at 192 Prospect street, Brooklyn. The child's head had been crushed with a two foot piece of wood, which, stained with blood, was found in the cellar.

children, a boy and a girl had been restored to their parents unharmed, scores of detectives in Brooklyn and Manhattan were put to work on the murder by Chief Deputy Inspector Cahalan. Their investigations finally led to one man, a boarder in an apartment of the house in which the body was found. Detectives said, however, that this suspect and his friends had given a very strong impression of his innocence.
After questioning all of the tenants and others in the neighborhood, Captain Carey called the father of Josephine and had him confront one of the men examined. Then three of the men questioned were taken to the Brooklyn police headquarters tonight for further examination, but none was detained under arrest. It was said that two of the men were witnesses.

NO CANDIDATES OVER 29 FOR YOUNG REPUBLICANS
Chicago, May 3.—The young element in the Republican party in Illinois is demanding that an age limit of fifty years be placed on candidates for all state offices. They seek to bar all "weed leaders," asserting that the older politicians are responsible for present factional quarrels.
Senator William B. McKinley would go under the age-limit wire by one year. Senator McCormick would have three years to spare, but the law would fall on Governor Small, former Mayor William Hale Thompson, former Governor Lowden, Deneen and Yates and former Senator Lawrence Y. Sherman among others.

Plan Model Village in France to Honor Bernhardt
Should be the Abode of Artists and Thinkers, Hence a Paris Suburb Is the Conclusion of Architect.
London, April 5.—(By Mail)—A society called "La Renaissance des Cites," which corresponds to the model town associations so familiar in England, has conceived the idea of creating a "Sarah Bernhardt Village" to commemorate the famous actress, reports the Paris correspondent of "The London Morning Post." M. Sardou is the architect whom the society will probably choose to carry out its scheme, should it prove possible. He is the son of Victorian Sardou, the author of innumerable plays and life long friend of Bernhardt.
The original idea was that a Sarah Bernhardt village should be built in the devastated regions, but M. Sardou insisted that the village must be a home for artists and thinkers, and must, therefore, be built close to Paris. It must be a suburb and a suburb easily reached by rail and tram. He said, in reply to an interviewer this morning, that it would be premature at the moment to say where the foundations of the Sarah Bernhardt village will be laid.
"Excelsior" suggests this morning that the Place du Chatelet should henceforth be called Place Sarah Bernhardt, and appeals to the Municipal Council to decree that the existing Theatre Sarah Bernhardt shall never bear another name as long as it is the property of the City of Paris.
While projects to perpetuate the memory of Sarah Bernhardt are in vogue, certain journals are raising the question of his birth. There seem to be two birth certificates, one representing her as having been born at Le Havre in 1856, the daughter of quite
