IRON, STEEL, METAL AND MACHINERY

In its summary of the iron, steel, metal and machinery markets, Canadian Machinery and Manufacturing News, Toronto, makes the following comment in its April 20 issue:

Practically no change has taken place on Canadian markets during the week.

The iron and steel section remains strongest of all, and there is quite a lot of talk to the effect that a slight advance will take place within the next ten days.

At present, bars are selling at \$2.75, but \$2.90 may be the new figure. Some time ago, an increase was made in the United States, but so far Canadian dealers have not moved up in sympathy, competition being so keen that they were afraid, and preferred to work on a closer margin.

Non-ferrous metals are weak, although scrap metals show signs of strength, although prices remain unchanged in both lines.

Pig iron is decidedly stronger, and several users are coming into the market, asking for speedy delivery. It is known that the material ordered is not for immediate use, but fear is expressed by some that non-union miners may go out, thus tying up the pig iron business. Prices are firm, and shading is practically non-existent. Montreal reports that

Buffalo producers have withdrawn all quotations.

Machine tools are in fair demand, and the same holds true for small tools and supplies. Oils, greases, waste, and other miscellaneous lines remain in fairly active demand, prices in all cases being the same.

The coal strike is beginning to make itself felt in the United States, especially in the iron and steel industry. The striking in non-union fields is responsible for the trouble, and several firms have had to bank or blow out a few furnaces. However, the situation is not serious, and after the Easter holidays, the non-union men are expected back to some extent at least. proves, and several users are sending in contracts to the mill with the price space left blank. No market is quotable, but prices are around \$21 for bessemer; \$20 for basic, and \$21 for foundry. This is \$1.50, \$2 and \$2, advance respectively, over the market two weeks ago. Wire mills, who so far have stayed out of the wire mill and staple advance, have entered the fold, and quote similar advances. This makes everybody quoting on the same level. Bars and small structural shapes are up \$2.50 a ton, but on attractive orders, prices have not advanced quite so much. Business generally is improving.
