Paris, April 4—A bill limiting the working day to eight hours will be introduced in the chamber of deputies on Tuesday next by order of Premier Clemenceau.

London, April 4—An optimistic view of the work of the industrial conference, comprising representatives of the employers and the trade unions of the United Kingdom was expressed at a joint meeting of the body held today to discuss a secret report made by the committee of ten that had been appointed to make recommendations as to an adjustment of the outstanding difficulties.

Arthur Henderson, the labor leader, in speaking of the result of the deliberations said: "We got along well. We do not anticipate any disagreement," while Sir Allen MacGregor, chairman of the managing committee of the engineering employers' federation, said the employers were prepared to honor the report immediately the trade union accepted it.
