RUSSIAN TROOPS

AND OURS PURSUE THE BOLSHEVIK

Ukrainian Peasant Leader Scores

Over Reds, Wins Towns and Soldiers

Archangel, April 19—(By the Associated Press)—The Russian and British troops pursuing the Bolshevik retreat- ing from Bialystok today had pro- gressed twenty versts southward. They had captured several prisoners and two three-inch guns, which the Bolsheviks were compelled to abandon in their hasty retreat.

Vienna, April 21—(By the Associated Press)—Forces commanded by General Petura, Ukrainian peasant leader, have retaken Zhitomir and Proskurov and al- so secured the recapture of 10,000 Bol- shevik troops, particularly those operat- ing in East Ukraine, according to a wireless despatch from Tarnopol.

It would appear that Petura's plan, which he forecast some time ago to the Associated Press, of cutting behind the Bolsheviks advancing into Besarabia and toward Odessa, is succeeding. It is said that he brought about the disaffec- tion of the Bolshevik soldiers partly by fighting and partly by persuasion. This success of the Ukrainian leader is reported, since the Bolsheviks executed 600 peasan- ters during their brief occupation of Zhitomir.

Petura is still hoping that the Allies will realize the advantage of assisting him. He and M. Holubowicz, premier of West Ukraine, have been heartened by recent visits of Allied missions at Stanislaw. During a conference at Odessa between the French and Ukrai- nian, it is asserted that the French ad- mitted they had been misinformed re- garding the Ukrainian government and that they were preparing to extend or- ganization and technical aid to the Ukrainian troops.

The sacrament of the Lord's Supper was dispensed at the morning service to a large number of communicants. A mixed quartette, chorus by the choir and solo along with the Easter hymns were very well rendered. The church was nicely decorated with Eas- ter flowers. A special Easter thank- offering was taken at the services.
