

Mac-Lean, acting minister of finance, in the commons this afternoon, tabled the main estimates for the fiscal year, which com-mences on April the first. The total \$252,793,099, which is a decrease of \$2-015,379 as compared with the estimates for the fiscal year, which closed on March 81. The estimates chargeable to consolidated revenue fund total \$224-826,109, an increase of \$22,917,813, as compared with the current fiscal year. On the other hand, however, the esti-mates chargeable to capital account ag-gregate only \$28,460,900, a decrease of \$24,68,192 with the proposed expendi-tures on public works chargeable to in-






