because on the face of it the thing appears bad.

But we condemn more often than we commend. We do not grant that an official is honestly endeavoring to do the best he can for the city at large. Instead we begin with the assumption that he always is trying to "put something over." We convict him without trial; we work on the theory that whatever he does is bad, until it is proved go d, and we never aid in securing the proof. Rather we sit back complacently, and idly, and often foolishly criticize. This destructive criticism works a three-fold injury. It harms the official by creating in the minds of the unthinking the suspicion that his intentions are not sincere. It harms the city because it places tremendous difficulties in the way of the official who is trying to better and improve conditions. It harms the ne who makes it;—first, by leading him into slipshod mental processes; and, second, by placing him in a low position in the eyes of thinking people, and thus considerably lessening his chances for doing really constructive work when the time comes for him to undertake such activities.

Because we are lazy and criticize things of which we know not, we are working a tremendous injury. But we can easily right the wrong, and in a short time, more than make reparation for it. Just be friendly critics. Interest ourselves in all questions of public welfare. Study them, analyze them, determine for ourselves by logic and reason the merit of them. Then, when we have done this, there is time enough to criticize. But the criticism should not take the form of a public controversy, which
