On motion of Mr. Torrance, seconded by Mr. Barrie, it was unanimously resolved,—That this Synod appoint a Committee on Funds, consisting of the Rev. Messrs. Drummond and Dunbar, with Robert Christie, Esq., whose duty it shall be to intimate, through the Magazine, and if necessary by Circular, to the different Ministers of Congregations, the month in which the collections should be taken up, for each scheme; the state and object of each Fund; and the duty of the Church to be liberal in their contributions.
