

- A.48 No sir.
- Q.49 So you don't know whether De Bartok signed it not.
A.49 No sir.
- Q.50 Who handed you the work ticket?
A.50 Corporal De Bartok.
- Q.51 Who gave it to him, did you?
A.51 Yes sir.
- Q.52 What did he do with it then?
A.52 He said he took it over to Captain Jessop.
- Q.53 From that time on you don't know everything that happened to it until you got it back. So that everything you have said about who signed the work ticket you don't know, do you? You weren't there when the ticket was signed.
A.53 Only that it - when it was handed back to me Captain Jessop had signed it. It had Captain Jessop's signature on it.
- Q.54 Isn't it a fact that you were in charge of work tickets?
A.54 Yes sir.
- Q.55 You had work tickets available to you, didn't you?
A.55 Yes sir.
- Q.56 And isn't it a fact that when there was an inspection at a later time - that there was an investigation of this matter and they found out that the work tickets had not been properly kept?
A.56 I don't know.
- Q.57 And that there were work tickets missing? You don't know that?
A.57 No sir.
- Q.58 You swear that on your oath that you don't know anything about missing work tickets? - on this inspection?
- Pros: I believe that all this testimony is on oath. I don't think that needs to be emphasized.
- JA: This is the cross-examination. You can carry on.
- The Defending Officer continues with the cross-examination of the witness:
- Q.59 Now, you weren't in the habit, you and De Bartok together were not in the habit of going visiting Captain Jessop, were you? The two of you together?
A.59 No sir.
- Q.60 No. And so this occasion that you mentioned when you and Corporal De Bartok - was this the only occasion that the two of you together ever visited him?
A.60 Yes sir.
- Q.61 That's right. And there was no-one else present but you and De Bartok and Captain Jessop?
A.61 That's right, sir.
- Q.62 And there's no doubt in your mind that it was on Wednesday the Twenty-Seventh of February and De Bartok came to you in the Tech Stores as you stated and took you to B squadron orderly room to see Captain Jessop. Is that correct?
A.62 Yes sir.
- Q.63 No doubt?
A.63 No sir.
