BISMARCK THOUGHT TO BE SERVING BUSSIAN DESIGNS REGARDLESS OF AUSTRIA.

BERLIN, Dec. 25 .- Advices from Vienna say it is reported there that a serious difference exists between the cabinets of Vienna and Berlin. It is claimed that Prince Bismarck is serving Russian designs without regard to the interests of Austria. Herr von Tieza, the Hungarian premier, it is stated, will soon hold a conference with Count Kalnoky, and will insist that the situation be cleared up, and that Bismarck be asked to declare whether Germany is an ally of Russia or of Austria-Hungary.
